In any given year, kitten season at Safe Haven is generally 6-8 months long. Sometimes it surprises us in March and sometimes it hangs around until December. Kittens that come through our doors in December are usually older kittens that may need some socialization and get snapped up pretty quickly.

In 2023, kitten season arrived in April. We began receiving calls about orphaned kittens found in city neighborhoods with cat colonies or kittens born to mamas who weren't the greatest at selecting a spot for their nest. We were getting requests to take in larger litters of kittens as well. Most years seemed to be marked by litters of 3 or 4 kittens. Litters of 5 kittens were considered large but in 2023 became the norm and litters as large as 7 were arriving. And they just kept coming.

Most litters required specialized care as respiratory and intestinal problems seemed to break out and travel through each kitten. Blood and stool samples were sent to labs and medications and supportive care such as probiotics and sub Q fluids were fine tuned. Some kittens required round the clock intensive care and Safe Haven is blessed to have fosters who are experienced in giving much needed treatments and who are willing to lose sleep to keep these little ones alive.

As fosters and volunteers waited to breathe a sigh of relief at the end of another kitten season, board members were asked to help out in homes where multiple litters of kittens along with many adult cats had become a situation that people were no longer able to care for this many cats and kittens. At least one of these situations began with the best intensions as the homeowner tried to care for local strays. But, with adult cats that were not spayed or neutered living together under one roof, a population explosion was just waiting to happen. Soon a few mouths to feed became dozens and illnesses were threatening the lives of kittens with immature immune systems.



The first large scale rescue mission began last December. 38 cats and kittens were residing in one home. Safe Haven took in 24 kittens under 1 year of age and transported the remainder to lowa Humane Alliance (IHA) to be spayed or neutered and then were either rehomed or returned to the owner.

Each kitten received normal vetting which included distemper vaccinations, wormers, flea medication, and ear mite medication. Rabies vaccinations were given to those over four months of age. Additionally, blood work/stool samples were sent in to help diagnose illnesses, oral and eye antibiotics were given, along with food and probiotics. The cost is approximately \$127 per kitten for a total cost of \$3040.

The 14 adult cats cost approximately \$80 per cat including the cost of spay and neuter surgeries and vaccinations for a total of \$1120. That brings the total of this mission to \$4160.

Most recently, Safe Haven has assisted in another population explosion in Iowa County. 2 mother cats and 12 kittens were taken in and 28 adult cats are being spayed and neutered at IHA and Farm & Family Veterinary in Victor. Most of the kittens are showing signs of upper respiratory and eye infections. Unfortunately, some kittens appeared to have suffered from a skin condition recently and at least 2 have tested positive for ringworm. This extends their stay at Safe Haven as they receive medications and baths until skin scrapings and hair samples no longer test positive for the fungus.

Treatment for ringworm alone will cost approximately \$30 per cat or kitten. Total cost for each cat and kitten from this rescue that has been taken to Safe Haven will run around around \$110 per cat for a total of \$1,540. The 28 cats that will be spayed and neutered will cost approximately \$80 per cat for a total of \$2240. The total of this rescue will be about \$3780.

In a few month's time, Safe Haven will have spent nearly \$8,000. All before kitten season has officially started. These situations alone are a very good reason to consider reaching out to Safe Haven to trap, spay, and neuter large groups of cats, whether outside colonies of feral cats or indoor cats. You can help support this vital mission by donating funds to help with vaccinations, medications, and surgeries or by donating redeemable cans and bottles that we collect to help defray the costs of surgeries.


















Out and About with Gabbie & Elinor
