How We Can Help

The animals at Safe Haven come to us in many different ways. We take in strays, animals from hoarding situations, and animals that have been relinquished to us. We have also taken in dogs from high kill shelters. In 2005, the very first dogs were rescued from a scheduled euthanasia after spending the required time in the pound in Marengo. At the time, if dogs were not reunited with their owners, the sad ending for many wonderful animals was euthanasia. The rescue of 2 dogs soon turned into more dogs and then cats in one stall of a garage and one unheated shed with no indoor plumbing. Safe Haven's volunteer numbers grew as quickly as the intake of strays.

Things have changed greatly in the last 19 years. With the larger number of intakes came the creation of a seven person board, state inspections, volunteer training sessions, safety protocols, and adhering to state legislation pertaining to animal shelters and pounds. Since we process over 200 adoptions in any given year, the handful of volunteers has turned into a non-profit organization with paid staff and a bustling team of 112 volunteers along with a shelter manager and care coordinators to keep everything running smoothly. The addition of a surgery suite with a licensed veterinarian and a team of volunteers has been beneficial for the health and well being of our animals.

We are so proud of all the growth Safe Haven has seen in nearly 2 decades. We are pleased to be able to provide services to the community beyond bringing together adoptable pets and their new owners. Here are ways we can assist members of the community and a few limitations we have:

- A pet food pantry for pet owners who need a little help in hard financial times.
- Transportation for cats to be spayed or neutered at Iowa Humane Alliance in Cedar Rapids.
- Fundraising to help cover the cost of spay and neuter surgeries of community cats and dogs.
- Pound services for Iowa County and the cities of Marengo and Williamsburg.
- · A Trap/Spay & Neuter/Release program for community and feral cats.
- · Assistance with rehoming pets through posts on www.wesavepets.com and social media.
- Foster homes to care for kittens or dogs in need of socialization, medical help, or training before adoption.
- · Volunteer opportunities that match many ability levels.
- Taking in relinquished pets that can no longer be cared for by their owner as Safe Haven resources allow.

All these helpful services are available to Iowa County residents, but not without following protocols in place that has allowed Safe Haven to grow into a thriving no-kill animal rescue.

- Animals cannot be dropped off at Safe Haven without an appointment.
- Paperwork (questionnaire) needs to be completed and the 7 member board votes on all animal intakes. The board
 considers the safety of the animal's current location, the health of the animal, or animals in cases of orphaned
 kittens, and the animals currently on Safe Haven's waiting list. You can request a questionnaire by visiting

- If a stray dog is found, the first step is to contact your local law enforcement (city or county).
- By state law, dogs held in the pound at Safe Haven may only be claimed by their owner if the dog is up to date on their rabies vaccination. Arrangements can be made for a veterinarian to vaccinate the dog at Safe Haven. The City of Marengo also requires additional paperwork before your pet can be released.

We know that these protocols can be frustrating, especially when you are trying to help an animal or you are trying to reunite with a family pet. We hope that you will have patience with Safe Haven staff and volunteers. We are certain everyone at Safe Haven wants the same outcome that you do and we look forward in playing a positive roll in connecting pets and owners.
